

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As I write the final Newsletter of the Autumn Term, never have I been more relieved to hear that it's raining! After 5 days of the most adverse weather conditions that the West Midlands has seen for the last 10 years, we are hopefully finally over the worst of it. I would like to sincerely thank all members of our community for your patience and support during this extremely challenging time. No school ever wants to operate emergency closure procedures but the safety of our students and staff is of paramount importance. I was very grateful for many of the messages that were put on our school Facebook site in support of the decision to close the school and put safety first.

One of the things that the adverse weather conditions did test was the effectiveness of our emergency closure procedure. Feedback to date indicates that posting details on the school website and emailing all staff and parents worked well. We will continue, therefore, to follow this procedure as laid out in the adverse weather conditions letter (recently published on the school website). The exception to this will be if we have an emergency closure whilst the school is in session. In this situation, we will send out a text alert sign posting you to our website.

So, now on to celebrate some of the highlights of this half-term.

Many of you will have enjoyed the Winter Concert which took place on 23rd November. This was a very successful event which reflects the talent and diversity of our musicians. A huge thank you to the Music Department and to our musicians for your hard work and commitment.

On 1st and 2nd December, we were very fortunate to experience our Dance Show Cases which took us Around the World in 80 Days. This production was yet another example of the hard work and dedication of our staff and students. Thank you to Miss Williams, Mr Handley, Mrs Aston and Mr Pounder for their support.

The last major celebration of 2017 will be the Christmas Carol Service, which will take place on Thursday 14th December. This year the Christmas Fayre will be organised by the PTA who are raising money to support the school developments. I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible supporting the evening.

The final day of term will be a day of celebration and thanksgiving and will involve reward assemblies and the school Christmas Lunch. It would be lovely to see as many students and staff as possible sharing in this occasion. The Christmas Lunch costs £3.00 for students and will be purchased using

the cashless system. Students will be asked to 'sign-up' for a Christmas Lunch by 14th December. As published on the website, the school day will end at 2.20 pm on 19th December in order to enable students and staff to travel home safely in daylight hours.

As the Spring Term begins on 3rd January, I respectfully ask for parental support in ensuring that students attend school appropriately dressed in full school uniform as outlined in the student organisers. Please consult the School Dress Code prior to buying new uniform to ensure that appropriate purchases are made. Any student who returns to school after the Christmas break with piercings, other than one in each ear lobe, will be asked to remove them with immediate effect. Please note also that the requirement for outdoor coats is plain navy or black coat/anorak of sensible design with no colour deviation.

I would also appreciate your ongoing support with keeping our school attendance as high as possible. Our attendance has been hit this term by some really nasty bugs which means that by the end of week 13 our average attendance was 96.6% compared with 96.9% for the same week in 2016/17. Our aim is to improve our attendance in the Spring Term to the same level as last year. We will continue working at this and will get in contact with you as necessary. Please find below the attendance broken down by year group for week ending:

Year 7: 97.7%

Year 8: 95.7%

Year 9: 96.7%

Year 10: 96.3%

Year 11: 96.5%

The Spring term will get off to a busy start with the first of our ski trips which leaves on Friday 5th January and returns on 12th January.

Finally, I would like to take the opportunity to wish you all a happy and holy Christmas and send every good wish for the New Year. I look forward to working with you all again in 2018.

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Communication with Parents/Carers Contact Information

We have been making much greater use of electronic communication between the school and parents/carers, sending letters and school information via email rather than sending letters home. It is therefore imperative that the contact details we hold for all parents/carers are kept fully up to date, including mobile number(s) and email addresses.

Text messages from school will come from the school text message service number **07860 095027**, this is a change from the original number we provided. Please save this number into your mobile contacts.

If you have changed your email address or mobile recently, or think that we might not have your correct details, please send in a letter to Mrs Millard with the correct information.

Having the correct contact telephone numbers is also vitally important when a pupil is ill and needs to be collected from school or as we have recently experienced emergency school closure due to adverse weather conditions.

If you do not have an email address, please inform us and we will make sure that important information reaches you by alternative methods.

Emergency School Closure

As we are now firmly in the winter months, I thought it would be helpful to outline our emergency closure procedures in the event that they are required. We are determined to do whatever we can to stay open to staff and pupils despite any adverse weather conditions or other emergencies.

We will endeavour to have done the following by 7.00am on any day we have to close the school:

- Notified the local radio stations.
- Sent an email to the addresses of the parents/carers with parental responsibility that we currently have on our database. Could I please ask that you keep us informed of any changes to your email addresses so that we can update our database to keep you better informed.
- Published a message on the school website (<http://www.hagleyrc.worcs.sch.uk>).

We will do all we can to stay open. However, if for health and safety reasons we have to close during the day and send pupils home before the normal end of the school day, we will not allow pupils in Years 7 – 11 to leave without confirming with a family member that they can do so. We are planning to do the following if we have to close during the school day:

- Notify the local radio stations.
- Send an email to the addresses of the parents/carers with parental responsibility that we currently have on our database.
- Publish a message on our website.
- Send all pupils to their tutor rooms.
- Ask any pupils who have mobile phones to contact their parents/carers. The form tutor will speak briefly to the parents/carers and check that the pupil can leave the school and make their own way home. We will contact the parent/carers of any pupils who do not have mobile phones. Pupils will be dismissed once parental permission has been given for pupils to leave the site.

I would suggest all parents/carers identify a place of safety, which may be your home, to which your son/daughter can go if we have to close.

I hope you appreciate that any decision to close the school is never made lightly. The safety of pupils, parents/carers and staff will always remain the priority when making decisions.

Adverse Weather School Day Arrangements

During periods of poor weather, there may be times when the weather conditions, although adverse, are not bad enough to close the school. On such occasions, the school will operate a slightly amended day as detailed below. We will notify parents/carers of the amended school day times by:

- Sending an email to the addresses of the parents/carers with parental responsibility that we currently have on our database.
- Publishing a message on the school website (<http://www.hagleyrc.worcs.sch.uk>).

On all such occasions, the start of the school day will be at 9:00am as usual. All pupils should travel as normal and when they arrive in school go directly to their form rooms and not wait outside in the cold. We do expect pupils to wear normal school uniform but we would encourage them to wear sensible footwear appropriate for the weather even if not part of the uniform code.

To assist with the return journey we do plan to change the school day so that we can finish at 14:55pm. During extreme weather the structure of the school day will be:

09:00 to 09:15	Registration
09:15 to 10:30	Lesson 1
10:30 to 10:45	Shortened break
10:45 to 12:00	Lesson 2
12:00 to 12:30	Shortened lunch break
12:30 to 13:45	Lesson 3
13:45 to 14:55	Lesson 4

This will allow the pupils to catch the 15:03pm service to Kidderminster or the 15:03pm service to Stourbridge.

Have access to their timetable?


See their achievements and behaviour?

Digital Christmas - Tips for Parents

Buying new tech for your children this Christmas? Don't forget about online safety.



It's that time of year again, and with the Christmas shopping well under way (at least for the prepared) many of us will be buying digital devices for children, with technology continuing to feature high on those wish lists for Santa.

This year's top gaming consoles include the Xbox One X, which was released on November 7th with its timing (just ahead of Christmas) being no coincidence. It retails for just under £450, but if Microsoft's price tag turns you off, then there's always last year's Sony PlayStation 4 Pro, which is available for just £300.

Children's fascination with tablets doesn't seem to be waning either. Whilst sales of adult tablets have continually declined over the last three years, specially designed tablets for children under ten have remained popular. This year sees the Kurio Tab Advance and the LeapPad 3 on the recommended lists. These give parents the reassurance of a 'safe' web browser or no Internet access and games and pre-loaded apps which are appropriate for children.

It's when children reach the age of ten or eleven that the desire for more sophisticated technology sets in. Young people may well become frustrated when they can't get the same games or apps as their friends have on Android or iPad. Devices such as the Amazon Fire 7 offer a happy medium, allowing parents to set up password-protected profiles so they can give each child access to only the books, games and apps they want them to see. But what happens when children reach an age where they want to interact with their friends online? Games consoles have always been highly targeted at the teenage market. Once designed solely for playing games, consoles are now connected to the Internet to allow a more interactive and collaborative experience. Consoles today don't just allow gamers to play games with others, but also allow them to exchange photos, engage in live messaging and even 'host' parties online.

Despite being very different devices, games consoles and tablets carry similar risks for young people. A recent study of 11-16 year olds held by Kaspersky made for interesting reading. Whilst 23 percent had been asked personal or suspicious personal questions online, as many as 20 percent said that they trusted the gaming platform so much that they would see no problem meeting contacts from it in real life. Nearly a third of the children in the study said that their parents had no idea who they talked to when they played games.

In the UK, a similar study held by the Oxford Internet Institute (OII) at Oxford University — which analysed Ofcom data from 515 homes with 12-15 year olds — found that eight percent of those who had been interviewed had been contacted by strangers. Four percent said they had encountered another person pretending to be them online and two percent had seen something of a sexual nature that had made them uncomfortable. Their parents were also interviewed about whether they had used technical tools to control or manage their child's access to online content. Only one-third of the parents said they used content filters, with two-thirds (66%) saying they had not. One quarter (24%) of the parents did not know or were unaware of the filter technology at the time of the interview.

But whilst filtering might seem like a quick fix, one that can be 'switched on' and then forgotten about, questions still remain about whether this is truly an effective way of protecting young people. Even the best filters are never completely watertight, and on the flip side, some filters can be so strictly configured that they can over-block, preventing teenagers from accessing helpful content on topics such as sexual relationships or drug and alcohol abuse.

Rather than prioritising Internet filtering, the OII study (amongst others) suggests we should place greater focus on educating and supporting teenagers about using the Internet responsibly, with emphasis on how teenagers manage online experiences that make them feel uncomfortable or scared. Parents should start the conversation about online safety at a young age, so more serious conversations about risk can be discussed as the child gets older. Once young people know that their parents understand what can happen online, it gives them greater confidence to approach parents for an open dialogue about any concerns and bring to light any negative experiences they might have had.

Parents should consider turning off cameras and geolocation settings in Christmas presents to protect their children from hackers, the Information Commissioners Office (ICO) has warned. Smart toys and wearable devices are among the most desirable children's toys this Christmas, but the regulator has warned their internet connectivity presents safety risks from hackers. The guidance comes amid growing concern about the susceptibility of cameras, microphones and sensors on toys to hacking.
