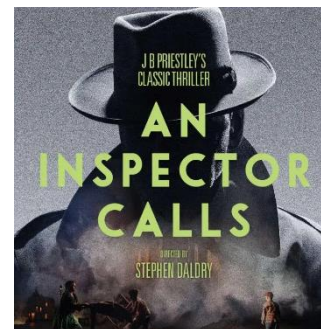

Theatre Visits for Years 7, 10 & 11

In the last fortnight, we have visited the Wolverhampton Grand Theatre twice, last week with Year 10 and 11 to watch a production of *An Inspector Calls* by JB Priestley (a GCSE set text), and this week to see *War Horse* based on the book by Michael Morpurgo (the Year 7 form reader).

Last week we marvelled at the sight of the Birlings' house collapsing on stage as their world view collapsed around them, and this week Mrs Barrett (and lots of the students!) shed a tear over the demise of a puppet horse. Going to the theatre is truly a magical experience and it was an absolute honour to take some of our students to their first ever live performance.

Year 7 War Horse Theatre Trip

On Wednesday I, along with 59 other Year 7 students, had the great pleasure of seeing *War Horse* by Michael Morpurgo at the Wolverhampton Grand Theatre.

War horse is set during World War One. It is a touching tale of a horse and his owner being forced to separate and hoping to find each other against all odds.

The actors were amazing, keeping the energy up throughout the performance and showing emotion so convincing I felt like I was witnessing a real World War One tale in the present. And the props...Wow! Originally, I was expecting a pantomime horse but instead I am greeted by magnificent Puppets made by the fantastic South African Handspring Puppet Company, which really brought the whole story to life.



The staging was brilliant. I have never seen a stage set up like *War Horse* was before. Hanging above the stage was a piece of canvas shaped like a scrap of paper which, throughout the play would show pencil sketches which served as a backdrop and turned a stage into a village, an auction, a cavalry charge. This backdrop was brilliant and tied in perfectly with the scene. The props and costumes were astonishing, with the soldier costumes and the accompanying props looking exactly like the real thing.



It was very emotional, and I am filled with nothing but praise for the wonderful show I witnessed. Huge shout out to the Wolverhampton Grand Theatre actors for the fantastic show they put on. An even bigger shout out to the teachers for putting up with 60 sugar-filled Year 7s and giving me the fantastic privilege of seeing this show.

Stourbridge Volleyball Club Shines with Talent from Hagley Catholic High



The Stourbridge Volleyball Club U18 team (photo left), has a strong representation from Hagley Catholic High School students. Their dedication has led to several players advancing to the Black Country team, which competes in the National Grand Prix.

Notably, the U16 Black Country squad features Tom, Anthony, Josh and Isaac, who have helped secure the team's impressive ranking of 11th in the country. Meanwhile, the U18 Black Country team includes Oliver Rattigan, Tom Barnbrook, and former pupils Tom Leashorne and Sean Mercado.

Hagley Catholic High School is looking to recruit a teacher of English and whole school literacy lead for the start of the next academic year. It would be desirable that the candidate can teach across all year groups from KS3 to KS5.

This is a fabulous opportunity in a very good school. The English Department is very experienced and well qualified. It has a team of ten staff all based in the same block, schemes of learning are well sequenced, and students make excellent progress. Students secure very good GCSE results, 91.1% achieving grades 9-4 in 2024 and 36.1% of students achieving 9-7 grades. The department also secured an excellent value added English score of +0.53, placing it well above the national average. Students achieve well in English at A level and are consistently above national averages, the highest performing subject in terms of progress with value added scores of +0.11 and +0.05 for Language/Literature in 2024.

English is consistently one of the highest performing subjects at Hagley and the successful candidate would quickly become part of a fabulous team with the opportunity to make a big impact.

As School Literacy Lead the successful candidate will be able to demonstrate a passion for reading and literacy, and the impact reading fluency and comprehension has on academic progress and lifelong opportunities. They will demonstrate an up-to-date knowledge on the latest research related to literacy development and will have a clarity of vision of how they can develop this area. Hagley Catholic High School is looking to recruit a fulltime teacher of RE. It is essential that the candidate can teach across KS3 and KS4, while teaching at KS5 teaching is desirable but not essential. The RE Department is very well regarded. It has an experienced and established team; schemes of learning are well sequenced, and students make excellent progress.

Students secure very good GCSE results, 82.8% achieving 9-4 grades in 2024 and 42.5% of students achieving 9-7 grades. The department also secured an excellent progress score of +0.69 in 2024 and an average grade 6, placing it well above the national average. Students achieve well in Religious Education at A level and are consistently above national averages. Average grade at A level in 2024 was a B-. Recruitment to A level RE is also very good with 10 students in current Year 13 and 12 students in the current Year 12.

The department has seven specialist teachers currently. The appointed candidate would be expected to provide a secure specialist knowledge of the RE curriculum, as well as being responsible for the continued promotion of the department and its success. RE is taught to all pupils in Key Stages 3 and 4, plus core RE at KS5. The appointed person would be responsible for leading Key Stage 3 and implementing the new Catholic RE Curriculum Directory. The appointed candidate would teach both KS3 and KS4, with opportunities to teach A level for the right candidate. The school is looking to appoint a committed and conscientious practitioner, with a passion for Religious Education and a desire to add to add further value to the subject and department as second in charge.
