It is hard to believe that three weeks have already passed this half term and that the students break up for February half term in 9 school days, it will be with us before we know it.


With that in mind I must continue with my routine reminders to please make sure you send your child to school every day. It really does matter and everyday does count.

However, in the meantime please do be aware that we award House Points to Behaviour Points at a ratio of 10:1 and we have awarded over 70,500 points this year, something to really celebrate. You can view your child's points in Arbor and they are now included in all school reports.


