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Uniform, standards and expectations

High standards of uniform and expectations has always been central to running a calm, ordered and safe school, where members of our family can come together unified by a common identity and set of expectations for all.

Of course, the unusually hot weather for the time of year has come as a shock but regardless uniform in the main has been exemplary and we have made reasonable adjustments to accommodate this.

However, from Monday when the temperatures will return to somewhere closer to normal we expect everyone to be in full uniform for the Autumn Term and this includes girls being in tights and not socks.

In addition, can I take this opportunity to remind everyone about some core uniform expectations for Year 7 to 11:

- 1. Girls skirts **must** not be rolled at the waistband but worn at all times as designed.
- 2. Piercings can only be worn in the ear, with a maximum of one small (4mm) plain stud in each lobe. Other facials piercings must be removed and cannot be concealed by plasters, this is not negotiable.
- 3. School shoes **must** be black leather shoes and **not** trainer type shoes with sports branding.

Transport (Buses)

Thandi buses have asked me to inform families that bus passes will be with us to distribute early next week. Students without their pass, once disseminated, will not be allowed to travel on the buses. The deadline for purchasing a pass for your child(ren) was 28th August 2023 and any passes purchased after this date cannot be guaranteed. The HC2 and HC4 routes have seen the greatest demand and no more tickets will be sold for these routes. We anticipate having to support Thandi in contacting some families to request moving to another route to maximise the use of the available capacity. Please also be aware that both the HC2 and HC4 do have a license for standing but Thandi are working to ensure everyone has an allocated seat.

Education Sunday

This Sunday is Education Sunday and churches across the Diocese and country will be praying for our schools. The Rt Reverence Bishop Marcus Stock, Chairman of the Catholic Education Service has written to all schools, and I have shared his letter at the end of mine.

Summer Exam results

I am delighted to be able to report some amazing outcomes from our exam years over the summer. Year 13 received their A Level and L3 vocational results on 17 August 2023 and it was great to be able to see so many students celebrating their superb outcomes and hear about the next steps in their educational or employment futures. Every single Year 13 student was able to secure a pathway of choice beyond Hagley, whether that was university, a higher level apprenticeship, employment or a gap year with university secured for September 2024. This is true testament to their hard work but also the provision and dedication of the specialist Hagley staff.

On Thursday 24 August Year 11 students received their GCSE and L1/2 vocational results. There was a fabulous atmosphere and buzz in school that morning as the relief and excitement overwhelmed each and every one of them. With GCSE assessments returning to the rigour of the pre-pandemic years this was a challenge that Hagley students rose to, and outcomes are in line with the excellent results we achieved in 2019 and place Hagley in the top 3 schools in Worcestershire for 6 out of the 10 most significant measures, and top 5 for all 10. This is once again testament to everyone; students, parents and school staff.

Let us invite Him to be with us over the coming academic year.
