COVID 19

As we enter the final week of what has felt like the longest term in educational history, I am so pleased to be able to reassure you all that the efforts and diligence we have all shown is paying dividends with only a handful of our community not in school currently due to the virus and no positive cases in over a fortnight. I do so hope we can maintain this till next Friday and all the way to those precious 5 days of Christmas between 23rd and 27th December that will be so precious and important to us all.
