However, any student who feels they would still rather take this precaution is most welcome, and no student will be forced to remove their face covering.

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# **Relationships and Sex Education (RSE)**

Our RSE curriculum has begun in earnest this term, as previously advised, and students have responded really well to the inclusion of this important curriculum area in their weekly timetable.

## **IWF** Campaign

As part of our commitment to a wider relationships, health and sex education we have also launched a project this week as part of the Internet Watch Foundation campaign focussing on "self-generated sexual imagery". This project will initially involve all girls in years 7 to 10 having focused sessions and workshops on this risks of sharing or being asked for any such imagery.

This campaign and project is particularly focused on girls because of the sharp rise nationally in 2020 cases of this imagery amongst girls.

However, parents and carers of our boys should be reassured that similar projects and curriculum content is planned for the boys too as part of their RSE curriculum.

### Future Operational Changes as we Move Towards 21<sup>st</sup> June

It is highly likely that this continued move out of COVID restrictions will lead to operational changes in school after half term, not least because we will have two year groups less in school, as Year 11 and 13 will not be required in school after half term.

I will write to you again before we break up to outline these changes for all students.

## Year 10 and 12 Exams

In the second half of the summer term Year 10 and 12 will sit their first set of Pre-Public Examinations (PPE's). These end of year one, of a two year programme of study, examinations will be an important opportunity for students to demonstrate the learning and progress they have made this past year. It will also serve to help staff understand where there are still areas of learning to recover, and subsequently map the second year of their curriculum.

The Year 10 core PPE's (RE, English, Science and Maths) will take place the week commencing  $21^{st}$  June and will be held under exam conditions in our exams halls. All other non-core exams will be completed between the  $7^{th} - 18^{th}$  June in classrooms.

For Year 12, PPE's will take place week commencing 28<sup>th</sup> June, and all of these examinations will be in exam venues.

Students will receive a timetable for their year 10 core PPE's and year 12 PPE's before half term.

# Year 10 Parent and Student Information Evening

We are very keen to be able to hold a face to face parent and student information evening for Year 10's towards the end of the summer term. A current provisional date for your diary is Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2021, all COVID restrictions allowing. I will, of course, write again directly to parents/carers of Year 10 in due course with further details.
