Logistical Arrangements After Half Term

We have made a few changes to the logistical arrangements for operating school safely for after half term and I have shared these with students via a virtual assembly this morning and the video is available in TEAMS for students to review again. The changes involve Year 7 and 11 changing bubble blocks and sittings for lunch being switched so that Year 10 and 11 now get first sitting and Year 7 and 8 second sitting. Year 9 continue to get first sitting in C block.



Train Travel

I am well aware of the frustrations that the inconsistency and uncertainty of the recent train timetable has caused for our students and families. I continue to work very closely, and daily, with West Midlands Rail with the support of the Station Manager from Stourbridge Junction to do all we can to ensure students get a train or bus safely to their destination station at the end of the school day.

After half term the winter timetable will have already begun, and I am reassured that there will be two trains running on the Kidderminster line after school, at 15:33 and 15:46, while there will also be two trains northbound to Stourbridge and beyond at 15:33 and 16:03. We will continue to endeavour to get all KS3 students on the 15:33 trains and KS4 and 5 students on the later trains.

Sixth Form Admission 2021

We are also very excited to currently be working on redeveloping our sixth form provision and plans are afoot to redevelop A block into a Sixth Form Centre for September 2021 and more details will come out about this in due course.


