Dear Parents/Carers and students

As always in education much has shifted again since I last wrote but what remains constant is the need for us to stay home and stay safe. I do hope that you are coping as families as we approach the end of a third week in national lockdown and with little light ahead for a removal of restrictions.

Yesterday I took time to watch the inauguration of President Biden. As part of the ceremony it was the poem of the Inaugural poet, Amanda Gorman, that resonated with me the most. She reminded us that "there is always light, if only we are brave enough to see it, if only we are brave enough to be it". I recognise that this was pertinent to the occasion she spoke at but regardless the sentiment reminds me of our calling to be the light of Christ in the world, beacons of hope for a better tomorrow, there for one another, that we might share a better tomorrow when it comes.

Our patron, St Nicholas Owen, was also that beacon of light and hope, back in the 16th and early 17th century, to priests and Catholics persecuted for practising their faith. Increasing Data Allowances on Mobile Devices to Support Disadvantaged Children

In case you missed it in the last letter a reminder that to support disadvantaged families the Government has released a scheme to increase data allowances on mobile devices.

Schools can request mobile data increases for children and young people who:

- do not have fixed broadband at home.
- cannot afford additional data for their devices.
- are experiencing disruption to their face-to-face education.

Children with access to a mobile phone on one of the following networks <u>might</u> be able to benefit: Three, Smarty, Virgin Mobile, EE, Tesco Mobile, Sky Mobile, O2, with other providers potentially joining the scheme.

We can make this request on your behalf and would need you to compete the form in this <u>link</u> to do so. If you have already completed this I have already submitted a request on your behalf.

Asymptomatic Lateral Flow Testing

This week guidance was changed by PHE and the DfE on serial testing in the event of a positive case in school. Therefore if a critical worker/vulnerable child, currently attending school does test positive then isolation protocols will need to be put in place for all close contacts of that child rather than serial testing.
