Dear parent(s)/carer(s) and students

Arbor

I have mentioned in previous letters that we are moving to a new Management Information System in January, and we shall be in touch early in January with information about how to register with the Arbor Parent Platform. This means that from January Class Charts will only report on a student's behaviour and house points, and their homework. It will still show attendance, but this will not be accurate and will need to be monitored in Arbor once you have your log ins. Eventually, and hopefully by February half term, all information will be accessed through Arbor and ClassCharts will cease.

Home test kits and January Testing

Students have been sent home with home tests kits today to allow for regular testing over the holidays.

A reminder that on Tuesday 4th January 2022 (our original return to school date) we shall be operating our Asymptomatic Testing Site (ATS) only. Consenting students will need to attend school for a test only and then return home. **Students do not need to wear their uniform**. School will then begin in earnest on Wednesday 5th January 2022 for all students at the usual time.

In order for your child to be part of this testing new consent needs to be obtained and you can supply this consent by completing the form at this link: <u>Asymptomatic testing consent form</u>. Students who are over the age of 16 can complete this form themselves.

On Monday 4th January 2022 testing will operate as follows:

All students who catch a Thandi bus should catch the bus as normal and ensure they are wearing a mask at all times. On arrival to school they will attend the ATS in the gym immediately for testing and once tested the buses will take them back home again. I anticipate that this will be around 10am.

For students who do not use the buses the ATS will operate as follows:

Year 7 will operate from 10.00am

Year 8 will operate from 11.00pm

Year 9 will operate from 12.00pm

Year 10 will operate from 1.00pm

Year 11 will operate from 2.00pm

Students in Year 12 and 13 can come at any time throughout the day.

Please note that siblings can arrive together and should come at the earliest allocated time.

Students must arrive at their allotted time and report to the gym. They will be sent home once tested and as long as their test is negative.

In the event that a student tests positive, they will be placed in isolation, and a parent/carer contacted to collect them and arrange a PCR test.

I would urge everyone to engage in this testing programme to ensure our return to school for the Spring Term is as COVID free as possible and we do all we can to avoid further lost learning days. I also appreciate that some families might not want their child to come in just for a COVID test and may choose to test at home instead.
