Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s)/Students

Another half term has come to an end, and it is has been a long one for everyone. I am sure, like me, you have noticed your children looking that little bit more fatigued this week, which is often the case when we have a 7 week half term compared to the usual 6 at this time of year.

I do hope you and all students can get a good dose of downtime this coming week and have something nice planned for half term.

This past half term the Catholic Liturgical Year has been in Ordinary Time, a time of year represented by the colour green. The Sunday Gospel's have reminded us of Jesus' miracles, his parables and the calling of his disciples and through scripture we are reminded of our own calling, the power of Christ and a reminder that we should not judge others.

When we return after half term Lent will begin on Wednesday 2nd March with Ash Wednesday. This liturgical season is represented by the colour purple, a colour synonymous with royalty but also with penance, preparation and sacrifice. We will be holding Ash Wednesday services for all years and throughout Lent taking part in Stations of the Cross around school and holding reconciliation services.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and is the period of 40 days that comes before Easter.

- The Israelites spent 40 years in the wilderness before entering the promised land.
- Moses fasted for 40 days before receiving the Ten Commandments.
- Jesus spent 40 days fasting in the wilderness before starting his ministry.

During Lent:

- Catholics fast from (give up) meat on Fridays and some meals on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- Almsgiving (giving to the poor) is particularly encouraged.
