This week we commemorated the Feast of St Matthew during Mass, on Tuesday, with Year 11, and we were very privileged to have the Dean of St Chad's Cathedral, Monsignor Tim Menezes, join us to celebrate the Eucharist.

St Matthew is credited with writing one of the four gospels but also well known for his calling as a disciple. Matthew, or Levi, as he was known, was a tax collector for the Romans and thus despised by his fellow Jews. One of my favourite paintings is Caravaggio's The Calling of Matthew, there is surprise in Matthew's face at his calling, as he points at himself. His own shock at being called reminds us, that Christ calls all of us.

We are gearing up in school for our Open Morning in 3 weeks' time and we already have 300+ families booked in for a visit on that morning. School will be keen for student support on the morning in showcasing departments or helping with tours, so please anticipate contact from us in the coming days for consent. A reminder that school will be closed to students on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> October for a staff training day.
