Dear Parents/Carers and students

I do hope that you all had a good dose of rest and relaxation over half term, especially the students, but also parents and carers too, even if it was just a break from online teaching and learning. Our return to school and learning this week has again brought a whole wealth of information to try and dissect and share with you but as I said to the students in assembly on Tuesday, we return with renewed hope and optimism that a brighter future is not too far away now.

### **Return to school**

The Government confirmed on Monday evening that secondary schools should open their doors again to all students from Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March. In order to facilitate a smooth return, and one that allows for all students, with consent, to be tested, secondary schools have been given the leeway to stagger the students' return.

Please bear with me while I continue to put together the final plans for this return which I will write to you about in detail next week.

# **Asymptomatic Testing**

When students return, all those with consent will be tested on their first day back at our Asymptomatic Testing Site (ATS) based in the school gym, and then every third day afterwards. Once all consenting students have received three Lateral Flow Device tests in school, they will be provided with Home Testing Kits to use twice a week until Easter, in the first instance. I shall write to you again to outline these procedures.

Students and parents/carers should be reassured about the testing process. We have been running out ATS since 7<sup>th</sup> January 2021. All staff have had certified training to take on their roles and we have had two successful quality assurance visits to check our procedures.

Students complete the test themselves and staff are only there to facilitate and process the test. All students are encouraged to take the test and we urge families to give consent if they have not already (Sixth Formers can provide their own consent) at this link: <u>LFD Testing Consent Form</u>

Please also be reassured that no one will be forced to test, even if consent has been provided.

#### Transport

On our return to school our usual transport arrangements will be back up and running in full, and once we have information on confirmed train times, we shall share them with you. Please do remind your child to ensure that if and when travelling on the school buses they sit in their designated seats and if, and when, on the train they do all they can to maximise distance with one another.

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# **Clinically Extremely Vulnerable Students**

If your child falls in to the category of Clinically Extremely Vulnerable (CEV) and as a consequence they will not be returning to school from week beginning Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March, on advice from a GP or the NHS, then please contact Mrs Brown (School Business Manager) on <u>tbrown@hagleyrc.worcs.sch.uk</u> to report this and liaise directly with your child's Head of Year about remote education from home.

### **Uniform and Equipment**

It is so important that when students return next week that in order to help get everyone back into routines and habits for positive behaviour and learning that uniform and equipment is at the high standards that we expect and that students reach.

Therefore please take some time over the next week to ensure that your son/daughter has everything they need to be fully prepared for school and learning on their return. This includes ensuring that their learning packs are in their bags and re-stocked. However, we will have resources available with their tutors where items from their learning packs are missing.

If you do have any concerns about uniform or equipment prior to the return to school, please do contact Mr Barratt on <u>gbarratt@hagleyrc.worcs.sch.uk</u> who will be more than happy to help and support. This includes any of our disadvantaged families who can apply for support with uniform.

### Exams

Yesterday Gavin Williamson (Secretary of State for Education) released the guidance for awarding grades to students who should have been taking formal exams this summer.
