



Dear parent(s)/carer(s) and students

It hard to believe that Advent is upon us with this Sunday being the first Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year. It's also only three weeks today till we break up for Christmas. Advent is such a lovely time in school and today our Christmas Trees have arrived to be decorated on Monday by our Chaplaincy Teams. Our thanks go to Spa Decorators and Mr Stockford (parent) at Churchill Forest Nurseries who have donated trees for us this year.

The light of the candle, so synonymous with Advent and the birth of Christ is more important than ever. There has been much darkness in recent times and as we light the candle on



our Advent wreath this coming week we will be reminded of the light that Christ is to us but also the light that our young people give too through their daily witness of the Gospel in their thoughts and actions.

Sporting Success

There has been much to celebrate this past fortnight in the Hagley World of Sport. The Under 13, 14, 15 and 16 girls netball teams are all top of their respect leagues. While the under 14 and 16s also placed 3rd in a National County tournament last weekend.

The Under 14 girls basketball team won their first match of the season against Kinver last night 46 - 32 and the Under 16 boys football team were crowned champions in the District 6 a-side tournament two weeks ago.

Our Under 18 boys football teams also had resounding victories on Wednesday against Old Swinford Hospital School with the A team winning 7-0 and the B team winning 3-2. While on the same night our Under 15 boys placed second in a 6 a-side district tournament.

On 12th November we had a large group of students compete in the Wyre Forest District Cross Country Championships. A huge well done to Abi R who won the Under 16 girls event with Grace C finishing 2nd and Lucy F placing 6th, for an overall first place for the team. The boys also placed well, coming 3rd overall with 4th and 7th place finishes for Gianluca and George L respectively.

Finally, Leo Handy (Y13) is competing in the British Weightlifting Championships on Saturday in Leeds, in the 67kg category. Leo has held the British title on 6 previous occasions, in various age categories, and we wish him well in hopefully repeating this success again.

COVID 19

It would be remiss of me not to continue to mention COVID in my letters. The virus has had a significant impact on us this past fortnight with numerous staff and students being struck down and having to isolate. Fortunately we have been able to procure staff to support us in ensuring lessons can continue but this is not the case in all schools and the demands on supply agency staff is greater than their capacity.

With the situation as it is please do continue to ensure that your child is testing twice a week, at the very minimum, so that we can isolate positive cases quickly and keep them from the school premises.

Arbor/Class Charts

In a previous letter I mentioned that in January we will be moving to a new Management Information System (MIS) called Arbor. This will lead to changes in how we communicate with parent(s)/carer(s) and how you can garner information about your child to include attendance, behaviour, homework, timetables, school communications and reports. In the long term this will completely replace Class Charts and the In-Touch messaging service but in the interim, while we switch systems, Class Charts will remain live for homework and behaviours. However I will be writing to you early in the new year to advise how you can access the

Arbor parent portal so that you can continue to receive the information you require. The new portal also enables parent(s)/carer(s) to update their contact information which should very much help with ensuring we are always up to date with any changes to your circumstances.

Assessment Calendar

Due to the implementation of our new MIS we have had to put the spring assessment and reporting schedule back a week and so reports will come out one week later than previously scheduled in January and February. You can find an updated copy of the reporting schedule on our website here.

PPEs

This last fortnight Year 11 have completed their second round of Pre-Public Exams (PPEs) or mocks in old money. They have been exemplary in their commitment to this process and should be congratulated for this. It will hold them in good stead for future examination windows and we hope that their energy and commitment to this is rewarded when their results are released on 14th December. Next week Year 13 begin their PPEs, and we wish them all the very best of luck with them.

Please note the third round of PPEs will be in February/March.
