

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

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

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Pastoral Care

- Students are placed in tutor groups based on information provided at transition meetings with their primary schools. A tutor group is a place to develop new friends and grow as a person.
- Students meet with their form tutor daily and start the day with line up under the canopy
- Form tutors are a key contact in supporting your child's wellbeing and welfare.

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

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
Anti-Bullying

 - School jumper is optional

- Navy blue tailored polo top with amber panels
- Plain navy blue shorts or skort
- Sports trainers
- Navy blue/White sports socks
- Optional items:
 - Navy blue sweatshirt
 - Plain navy blue base layer
 - Plain navy blue sports leggings











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- Coats should be a plain dark colour preferably navy or black with no colour deviations.
- Hats, scarves and gloves should be navy/black.
- Hoodies are not permitted to be worn to and from, or in school.
- Black shoes trainers are not permitted. No sports brands/logos.

- <u>No</u> extreme haircuts or hair colouring including skin fades
- Piercings one small plain stud may be worn in each ear. No other piercings are permitted.
- Jewellery the only permitted jewellery is a watch.
- Make up should be discreet.
- False eyelashes, varnished/acrylic/gel/shellac nails are not allowed

- Ruler (ideally 30cm)

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Emmaus Catholic MAC Prayer


